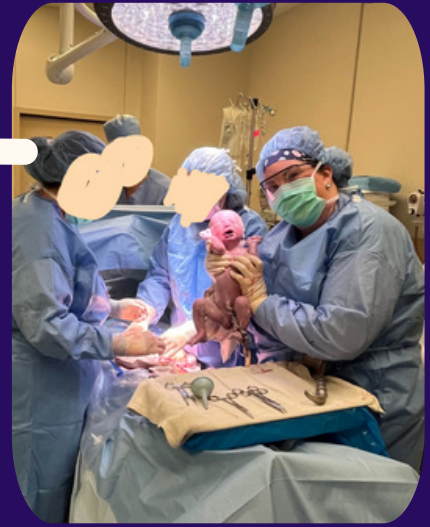

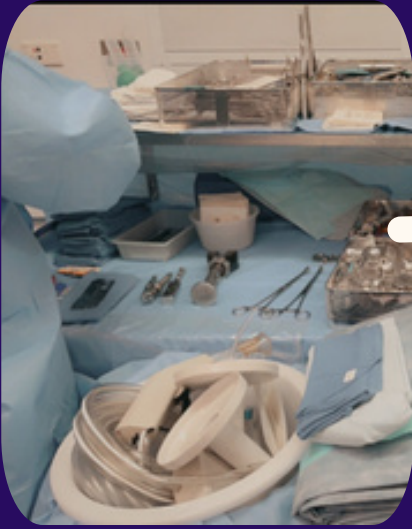

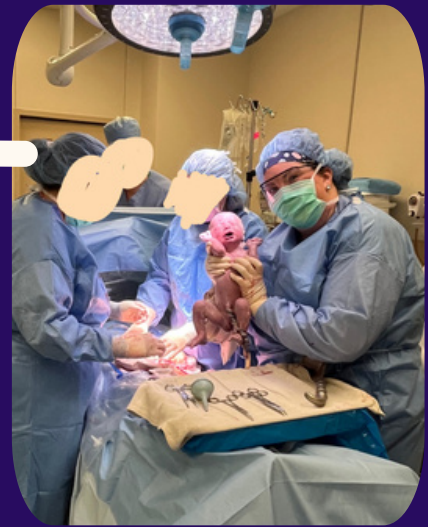
Karen Buxton (Christine)
